Avoiding Plagiarism

Plagiarism is the act of using someone else's thoughts and words, claiming them as your own and not giving credit through correct referencing. It is a serious offence in Australia. It is wise to avoid plagiarism at all costs, to increase learning, and empower your understanding of the course content. The University of Canberra offers a text matching program called URKUND. It is not a plagiarism detector. You may submit your assignment prior to submission to check any text which appears in other sources which will be seen by your teacher. It takes 24 hours for the report to be returned to you, so ensure that you give yourself time to re-write and submit your work. There are many plagiarism detector sites available. Here are two free sites to assist you.

<u>Viper</u> - you will need to register, however; the service is good and free.

Quetext- a good simple site with no registration required.

<u>Grammarly</u> will detect plagiarism, proofread your assignments and correct your grammar, however, there is a cost involved. By creating an account there is a free grammar and spelling service available on all your devices.

To ensure that you don't plagiarise, it's vital that you learn to reference correctly. There are guides here and also classes and assistance available in the GBCA Library.
