- Applicants must have a bachelor degree or equivalent as approved by the University. There are no work experience requirements. Students who have undertaken an undergraduate degree with a major in accounting with an Australian institution are ineligible for entry to the degree.
- English Language Requirements: Academic IELTS of 6.0 or equivalent, with no band score below 6.0

(Application after 5th August 2018, Academic IELTS of 6.5 or equivalent, with no band score below 6.0)
