

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


LIVING IN MELBOURNE



ENTERTAINMENT



This course is specifically designed as a pathway program for students who are planning to pursue a Bachelor degree at University of Canberra after completing the Diploma of Business at GBCA. Students who successfully complete this course with GBCA are eligible for advanced standing of up to equivalent of one year into: Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting) at University of Canberra (CPA accredited)

COURSE OVERVIEW

UC in Melbourne Pathways provide alternative entry options for getting into your dream course at UC. Our pathways are designed to suit all types of students, even for students who have just finished secondary school.

GBCA's Diploma of Business is one-year, full-time programs specifically designed for students who would benefit from a supported entry to tertiary study. Completion of a GBCA diploma provides up to one year of credit and guaranteed entry to Bachelor of Business (subject to availability and meeting academic criteria).

Students will acquire work-ready skills through participating in active learning activities including: analysing business cases, writing business reports, debating, negotiating and presenting ideas. This course will also prepare students with assignment writing, analytical reading, listening and note taking skills to help them succeed in the future university learning environment.

MASTER OF COMMERCE (ACCOUNTING)

COURSE OVERVIEW

The Master of Professional Accounting is designed for accounting professionals, who are keen to perform high-level accounting and financial transactions and navigate in an increasingly complex legal, economic and global business environment.

Upon completion, you will also be able to make ethical, socially responsible and sustainable business decisions whilst demonstrating a high level of personal autonomy and accountability.

The course presents students with a range of Work Integrated Learning (WIL) opportunities, including real-world research projects, case studies, actual industry briefs and more. You will develop work-ready technical accountancy skills and be confident in using a range of industry-standard accounting packages.

In addition, you can choose to undertake an internship in Year 2 as part of the course's open elective units. The faculty runs an optional three-week 'pre-internship preparation program', where students learn essential employment skills and interview techniques. The program includes a series of interviews hosted by Canberra-based accounting firms, with successful candidates going on to secure internships.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must have a bachelor degree or equivalent as approved by the University. There are no work experience requirements. Students who have undertaken an undergraduate degree with a major in accounting with an Australian institution are ineligible for entry to the degree.

- English Language Requirements for International Students: Academic IELTS of 6.5 or equivalent, with no band score below 6.0.



According to the Department of Home and Affairs, as a general guide, apart from the costs of studying in Australia, you should have enough funds to cover your travel costs and 12 months of living expenses and tuition fees. You must demonstrate that the funds you are relying upon can meet these costs and are available during your stay in Australia.

You will need to consider other expenses such as bond payment and advanced rent, furniture, textbooks, study excursions and equipment, and other emergency expenses.

The exchange rates between the Australian dollar and your currency is important to consider.




